The Louisiana Trust for Historic Preservation is proud to announce the winners of its 2018 Preservation Awards, which will be presented at its annual soiree on Wednesday, May 16. The Louisiana Trust recognizes historic leaders and projects from around the state for their important work in support of historic preservation.

Senator Bill Cassidy will be awarded the *Sue Turner Preservationist of the Year Award*, for his work to preserve the Federal Rehabilitation Tax Credit during the 2017 tax reform. This included sponsoring an amendment to maintain the credit at 20% of eligible expenses. A loss or decrease in the amount of the credit would have made many historic rehabilitation projects too costly. Since 2002, the Federal Rehabilitation Tax Credit has created over 38,000 jobs and fostered over \$2.5 billion in private investment in Louisiana. On the national level, the Federal Rehabilitation Tax Credit has created over 2.4 million jobs, encouraged over \$131 billion in private investment and made the rehabilitation of over 42,000 historic buildings possible, while providing a net positive investment to U.S. taxpayers.

Both the Federal Rehabilitation Tax Credit and the LA State Rehabilitation Tax Credit are earned credits, which are awarded after projects are reviewed and certified, to insure the work maintains a building's historic character.

"The historic tax credit has helped revitalize hundreds of buildings in Louisiana, creating jobs for workers and preserving our architectural heritage for future generations," said Dr. Cassidy. "Supporting historic preservation in tax reform was a top priority for me. I'm honored to receive this award."

Main Street Award - Recognizes a Main Street community that exemplifies the strategic use of creativity, historic preservation and/or culture to build a climate for cultural expression, improve quality of life, enhance existing assets and strengthen economic opportunity while respecting the quality of the area.
